

Scarinish pier, by the Tiree Association of Glasgow shows that in the First War 90 died, while in the Second War 32 new names were added to the list of the fallen.

*Population.* The record of Tiree as regards population is shown by the Census figures: (1801), 4,001; (1811), 4,142; (1821), 4,181; (1831), 4,453; (1841), 4,391; (1851), 3,709; (1861), 3,217; (1871), 2,837; (1881), 2,733; (1891), 2,452; (1901), 2,195; (1911), 1,825; (1921), 1,716; (1931), 1,451; (1951), 1,219. It will be seen that from 1841 onward there has been a heavy decrease at each period until the point was reached in 1951 when the population was less than one-third of what it had been a century earlier.
