EXTRACTED from the REGISTER BOOK of BIRTHS, for the District of Tyree, in the
County of Argyll, this 15th day of June 1920.

The Registers of Births, Deaths, and Marriages respectively, pertaining to every Registration District in Scotland, are kept in duplicate for each year; and after being examined and compared, one of the duplicates is retained by the Local Registrar, while the other is transmitted to the Registrar-General in Edinburgh. Every person is entitled to search such Registers, and any relative Inventories or Indexes in the custody of the Registrar, upon the days and during the hours of business fixed by the Sheriff, or, where no special regulation has been made by him upon the subject, at all reasonable hours on any lawful day, on payment of a fee of 2s. for a General, and 1s. for a Particular Search, and to have an Extract of any Entry in the said Registers for the further sum of 2s. 1d., including Stamp Duty. In the case of a Particular Search, the applicant must indicate a particular name or entry; while in the case of a General Search, he does not require to specify the object of such search. Every Extract of any Entry in the Register Books, kept under the provisions of the Registration Acts (17 & 18 Vict. c. 80, 18 Vict. c. 29, and 23 & 24 Vict. c. 85), duly authenticated and signed, is admissible as evidence in all parts of His Majesty's dominions without any other proof of such Entry.

The 62d Section of the Statute 17 & 18 Vict. c. 80 enacts, that "every person who shall wilfully or maliciously destroy, obliterate, erase, or injure any such Register, or shall cause to be destroyed, obliterated, erased, or injured any such Register, or shall cause to be made or given pursuant to this Act, or shall falsely make or counterfeit any such Register or Duplicate, or any such Minute, Notice, or Certificate, or any such Register or Duplicate any false or fictitious Entry of or any false or fictitious name, or shall wilfully give any false Certificate, or falsify any Certificate, or shall certify the same to be false or fictitious in any part thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to be punished by Transportation for a period not exceeding Seven Years, or by

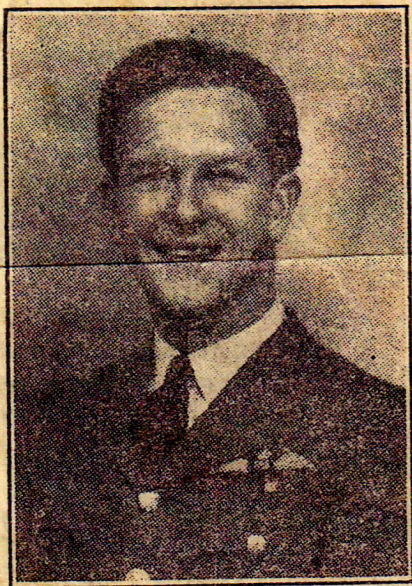

KILLED IN FLYING ACCIDENT



FLYING OFFICER IAN LAMONT

THE DEATH OF FLYING OFFICER IAN LAMONT recently occurred in the South of England when on a test exercise with a jet meteor 'plane. The deceased was an able and experienced pilot, having flown many types of 'planes, being later selected to fly the jet. He was one of three flying officers from Scotland privileged then to do so.

Before joining the R.A.F. F/O Lamont was a student at the West of Scotland Agricultural College, Glasgow.

A brother-officer writes as follows in the "Middlesex Courier":—Flying Officer Lamont's coolness and superb courage in face of the greatest danger, was an inspiration to all of us, and to-day we feel much the poorer by his passing."

His bereaved family received letters of condolence from Their Majesties at Buckingham Palace, the Secretary of State for Air, and also from the R.A.F. stations at Manston, Halbarington and Colerne, all testifying to the esteem in which F/O Lamont was held.

His five brothers (the youngest now on a course for his commission) and a sister demobilised, have served throughout the war, truly a fine record for the Island of Tiree, which this gallant family claim as their birth-place.
