

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY STATIONS IN ARGYLL.

The sites of three **wireless** telegraphic stations in the county of Argyll have been decided upon, and at two of them, Machrihanish and Tiree, building operations are in a more or less state of forwardness. The erection of the tower of the experimental station at Machrihanish, which is being built by the Brown Hoisting Company, New York, is nearing completion. The tower is 400 feet high, and is situated near Uisead Point. The corresponding tower on the American side, is on the north side of Boston, and was finished some months ago. The station at Machrihanish is to be used by the National Electric Signalling Company, of Pittsburg, for experimental work. The arrangements for building the houses in connection with the Marconi telegraph station in Tiree were made in autumn of last year, and work was begun then. The telegraph mast is to be set up at the foot of Hough Hill, on the northwest of Tiree. Now negotiations are proceeding for the erection of a **wireless** telegraph station at Tobermory for communication with Lochboisdale in South Uist.
