


Hugh MacDougall 1857-1929. Born in Tiree, Died in London (Kent) after a long career in Amoy, China.

2. **Donald MacDougall** (1809-1886) and his wife **Euphemia MacInnes** (1923-1902) had the following family -
Hugh, Lachlan, Alexander, Catriona, and Marian and Sarah, both of whom died in infancy. Lachlan and Catriona stayed on the family croft in Vault. Alexander married **Mary MacKinnon (Màiri Lachainn 'ic Thearlaich)**, also of Vault, and moved to Oban where his two grandchildren, Euphemia (Phemie) and Mary live to this day. Hugh born 1857, qualified as a doctor in Glasgow University and apart from a year spent in London as a young man, spent his entire working life as a doctor in Amoy, China. He died in London on the eighteenth of March, 1929.

He graduated from Glasgow university in 1880 with a Bachelor in Medicine, Master of Surgery.

MR. H. McDUGALL.

Mr. H. McDougall, M.B., CM., of Ku- langsu, Amoy, was born in Scotland in 1858, and was educated at Glasgow High School and University. After qualifying, he worked for some time at the Great Western Infirmary. In 1882 he came to Amoy as assistant to Dr. (now Sir) Patrick Manson and Dr. Ringer, and has been practising in the town ever since.

Note Patrick Manson: 'The founding father of tropical Medicine'. Manson played a fundamental part in the research into the link between mosquitos and malaria transmission. Perhaps Hugh was also involved in this research, being Manson's assistant during this period.
