20.	Hector McKinnon	Do.	20. Fisherman. Separated from wife. Lives with a sister. Has cow. No means.
21.	Archd. MacLean	Do.	21. Shoemaker. Keeps small shop. Has 2 cows. Is reputed to have a little means. Is an elder in Heylipol Church.

59.	Neil McMillan	Do.	59. Fisherman. Got loan from the Marquis of Lorne to buy fishing boat, which has not been repaid. Poor, no means.
60.	Archd. Kennedy	Do.	60. Fisherman. Son of No.49. No means.
61.	Archd. McLeod	Do.	61. Labourer. Single. Living with mother. Has cow – poor, no means.
62.	John McKinnon	Kilkenneth	62. Blacksmith. Son of widow Neil McKinnon Crofter Kilkenneth. Is an elder in Heylipol Church. Has cow, no other means.
63.	Alex. McIntyre	Do.	63. Mason. Old, frail and very poor, applied lately for Parochial relief.
64.	Arch. McLean	Do.	64. Labourer. Works occasionally on Hough Farm. Has cow, no other means.
65.	Neil Kennedy	Do.	65. Labourer. Son of widow Alexander Kennedy crofter Kilkenneth – poor, no means.

67.	John McKinnon	Do.	67. Young lad living with his father No. 62 learning the blacksmith trade.
68.	Neil Carmichael	Barrapol	68. Labourer. Employed at Kelp works. Single. Lives with sisters and brothers. Has cow, no other means.
69.	Lachlan Morrison	Do.	69. Herd on Barrapol Township. Single. Lives with sister and brothers. Has cow. No means.
70.	Donald McNeill	Do.	70. Sailor. Single. Lives with No. 71 a brother. No means.
71.	Duncan McNeil	Do.	71. Labourer. Single. Reputed to have means. Has horse & cow. Lives with mother & brother No. 70.
72.	Lachlan McFadyen	Do.	72. Joiner. Brother to A. & I. McFadyen Crofters Barrapol. Has house on their Crofts. Has cow, no means.
73.	Hector McFarlane	Balemartin	73. Labourer. Young man. Single. Living with father Donald McFarlane. Very poor – no means whatever.
74.	John McKinnon	Do.	74. Fisherman, middle aged, poor, no means.

75.	Archd. McLean	Balemartin	75. Farm servant. Single. When at home lives with mother who is a pauper.
76.	Charles Campbell	Do.	76. Fisherman. Supported by family who are out in the world and doing well.
77.	Neil Lamont	Do.	77. Shoemaker & fisherman. Very poor. Supported a good deal by children begging.
78.	Neil McDonald	Do.	78. Fisherman – poor, no means. Supported a good deal by children who are at service
79.	Allan McLean	Do.	79. Fisherman. Middle aged. Single. Living with sister, no means.
80.	Neil McKinnon	Do.	80. Sailor. Has slated house. Has cow & pony. No other means. Old man.
81.	Duncan McArthur	Do.	81. Labourer. Poor & delicate. Was for years in receipt of Parochial Relief though not at present.
82.	Donald McDonald	Do.	82. Fisherman. Old man. He has got Loan from Duke of Argyll to buy a fishing boat which has not been repaid.
83.	Hector McDonald	Do.	83. Fisherman. Supports himself at present by driving van for Hynish Shop. No means.
84.	Neil Kennedy	Mannal	84. Joiner. Was in Manitoba but did not succeed. No means.
85.	Thomas Campbell	Do.	85. Employed as Signal man at Lighthouse Tower Hynish. Has house at Hynish
86.	John Lamont	Do.	86. Labourer. Old man. Has horse & cow. No other means.
87.	John Lamont Junr.	Do.	87. Labourer & fisherman. Poor, no means. Son of No. 86.
88.	Donald McMillan	Do.	88. A pauper for many years – very old.
89.	Hector Campbell	Do.	89. Fisherman – poor, no means. Promised to pay rent for site for house, but never paid.
90.	Malcolm Campbell	Do.	90. Fisherman – poor, no means. Promised to pay rent for site for house but never paid.
91.	Lachlan McDonald	Do.	91. Fisherman. Old man – supported by sons who are at sea. Poor, no means.
92.	John Campbell	Balinoe	92. Fisherman. Got loan along with other fisherman from the Duke of Argyll to buy family boat, which is not yet repaid.
93.	Alexander McNeill	Do.	93. Merchant. Reputed to have means. Has house & cattle. Promised to pay rent for site of house but does not pay.

94.	John Paterson	Balinoe	94. Labourer. Has horse & cow & some sheep. No other means. Single. Lives with mother.
95.	Alexander McKinnon	Do.	95. Fisherman. Poor, no means.
96.	Donald McArthur	Do.	96. Sailor. Single. When in Tiree lives with sister who has a house in Balinoe. Poor, no means.
97.	Colin McLean	Do.	97. Young lad living with widowed mother who I believe is in receipt of Parochial relief.
98.	Charles McLean	Do.	98. Farm servant. When in Tiree lives with mother who has a house in Balinoe. Poor, no means.
99.	Neil Campbell	Do.	99. Labourer. Occasionally employed at Heylipol farm. Has cow, no other means.
100.	Donald Cameron	Craignish	100. Fisherman. Old man. Has two or three sons living with him who support themselves by fishing.
101.	H. McDougall	Vaul	101. Fisherman. Single. Lives with mother who has a house in Vaul, no means.
102.	Dugald Colquhoun	Do.	102. Labourer. Old, frail, very poor, no means.
103.	Hector Cameron	Cornaigmore	103. Joiner. Keeps a small shop. Has a cow. May have a little means.
104.	Archd. Campbell	Do.	104. Sailor. Is generally away at sea. No means.
105.	Hugh McPhail	Do.	105. Merchant on small scale. Was for years in Australia. Reputed to have means. Has horse & cow.
106.	Neil Lamont	Do.	106. One time tenant of Cornaigmore farm. Single. Lives with brother in law No. 107. Latterly in receipt of Parochial relief.
107.	Robert McDougall	Do.	107. Farm servant. Has cow. Poor, no means.
108.	Alexander McKechnie	Moss	108. Farm servant. Is married to granddaughter of Widow Neil Munn Kilmoluag with whom he lives and works croft for her. His mother has house in Moss.
109.	Hector McDonald	Kenovay	109. Cartwright. Poor, no means. His sons who are at service help him.
110.	Neil McLean	Do.	110. Farm servant. Single. When in Tiree lives with his mother who has a house in Kenovay.
111.	John Walker	Stornoway	111. Same as No. 16.
112.	Neil McArthur	Ruaig	112. No occupation. Old man supported by son who is Post runner to East End.

113.	John McKinnon	Ruaig	113. Fisherman. Old man living with sister, no means.
114.	Neil McLeod	Do.	114. Carpenter. Old man supported by family who are at service. Has cow.
115.	Donald McInnes	Do.	115. Fisherman. Old man. Single. Living with sister, no means.
116.	John Black	Balephuill	116. Sailor. Got loan from Marquis of Lorne along with No. 45 to buy fishing boat, which is not yet repaid.
