Police Report Donald M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon Nephew of and residing with Sarah M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon Cotter Cornaig Hector M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon son of and residing with Donald MacKinnon Crofter Cornaig and Lachlan M<sup>c</sup>Innes son of and residing with Lachlan M<sup>c</sup>Innes Crofter Bousd all of them in the Island of Coll and Parish of Coll and County of Argyll are charged with the crime of Breach of the Peace actor or art and Part in so far as on Saturday the tenth day of November 1866 years the said Donald M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon Hector M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon and Lachlan M<sup>c</sup>Innes did conduct themselves in a drunken riotous and disorderly manner to the annoyance of the lieges and Breach of the Peace did quarrel and fight and that at march gate between Torrosdan and Cornaig Island of Coll Parish of Coll and County of Argyll aforesaid the gate is situated half a mile west from the house of John Campbell Esq<sup>r</sup> Cornaig

and at the march gate between Torrosdan and Cornaig Donald M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon Hector M<sup>c</sup>Kinnon and Lachlan M<sup>c</sup>Innes mentioned above striped themselves to their shirts and began to fight and did conduct themselves in a most disorderly manner.
