Are all charged with malicious Mischief. So far as about 8 P.M. on Monday 12th Nov^r.
last and at the Dwelling House, and in the garden Situated at Heylipoll, Tyree aforesaid, and occupied
by John M^cFarlane a Teacher residing there, The said Archibald M^cLean, George Campbell, Colin
M^cArthur, John Campbell & Roderick M^cKinnon did conduct themselves in a disorderly manner, and
did pull and destroy a number of greens and cabbage stocks, the property of the said John M^cFarlane,
and did smash the said Stocks, or stones to the door & windows of said Dwelling House & did throw
the wheelbarrow in the middle of the dungstead, all to the terror & alarm of the inmates of said
Dwelling House.
